

Millions of Californians Could Lose Medi-Cal Health Coverage During the Redetermination Period

What is Redetermination?

Medi-Cal is California's Medicaid program. This is a public health insurance program for low-income individuals and people with certain diseases.

Many Medi-Cal members will receive a notice during redetermination, which is a free annual process to review and renew eligibility.



About **3.5 million more** Californians enrolled in Medi-Cal in 2023 compared to 2020.

Medi-Cal enrollment increased by 26.5%, to **16 million** from 12.6 million, during three years (April 2020-April 2023) **without review and renewal.**



Some members may auto-renew because the county might have enough information

How to Renew or Keep Coverage



You may **qualify for Medi-Cal** if you are part of **Public Assistance Programs.**



Fill it out and return it right away to **keep yourself and your family covered.**



If you **receive a renewal form** in the mail, your **county needs more information.**

Why Might I Lose Coverage?



Medi-Cal coverage could end if the renewal form isn't returned, the county does not receive **updated household information** or the member is **no longer eligible** (based on income or other factors).
